I an is the gentleman responsible for designing and creating small wooden cars which are given out to paediatric patients and their families. The cars come with a crayon or pencil, so children are able to decorate their new wheels however they please!

We sat down with Ian to learn more about him and his toys, what motivates him and his creative process.

Ian has always believed he is a privileged person – not privileged money-wise - just privileged. "So therefore I've always been associated with helping others who aren't as lucky," he says.

After retiring he came across an organisation that donated swags to people who were homeless. Thinking it was a great cause, Ian started to collect money in front of shops throughout Canberra to support the organisation. "It was hard at first, but I soon perfected my tactics – I had a table, a chair, a smile, red pants and a swag."

Everything was going well until Ian had a heart attack, and it was decided between him and his wife that he'd stop collecting.

"I felt lonely when it stopped," says Ian.
"It was something I enjoyed, and I
missed seeing people at the shops."

Ian then heard that a group at his retirement village was donating knitted items to Aboriginal communities. Ian thought he'd contribute by making some cars that would appeal to young boys.

"Only problem was, I'd never used a hammer in my life!" said Ian. "But I figured it out and came up with a design and a plan."

Someone then told Ian about the *Canberra Hospital Foundation*, so he got in touch with Amy, and the rest is history!

The cars are made out of recycled timber at Ian's local Men's Shed. He paints a strip of paint on each car to give it that added personal touch. His goal is to make 1000 cars by the end of the year.

Ian really enjoys making the toys, it's his creative outlet. He says the fact that they bring so much joy to young patients is a lovely added bonus.

We are so grateful for Ian's donations. As soon as a new batch comes in, it's not uncommon that they fly off the shelves like hotcakes. By all accounts from healthcare workers, patients and siblings are so joyful when they receive a car, and families are grateful for the welcomed distraction from treatment.
