CANBERRA SHARES THE CARE

In an awe-inspiring show of heart from the Canberra Community at the height of the coronavirus crisis, over 3,600 donations were received and distributed amongst healthcare workers throughout Canberra Health Services, offering encouragement, solidarity and one strong, resounding message, "thank you for keeping us safe."

CHF launched #CHFCareShare in response to the changes and challenges brought about by the coronavirus pandemic. We put the call out to the Canberra community to show their support and encouragement for healthcare workers, and the response from the individuals, community groups and local businesses blew everyone away. Canberrans came together— while maintaining social distancing—offering encouragement and solidarity.

Donations of restaurant cooked meals warmed the bellies of nearly 1,000 healthcare workers, while others received self-care pamper packages, chocolates, fruits, and hand-drawn cards of love and support from school children. From the security team to cleaning staff, administrators to allied health professionals, nurses and doctorsworkers from over 90 divisions and departments of Canberra Health Services were acknowledged for their hard work and touched by the community's thoughtfulness and kindness.

CHF Office Manager Amy Agius facilitated the distribution of donations and saw first-hand the impact they had on healthcare workers. "The reaction to the donations was beautiful" reflects Amy. "A lot of them became guite emotional at the fact that they had received these donations and when we approached the areas to tell them who was giving them gifts and why, they just felt loved, cared for, really special and super humbled."

The Canberra Hospital Foundation team signed up to Dry July this month to help raise funds to support patients affected by cancer in Canberra and the surrounding region. It's been a fun challenge for us all and we are grateful we can do something personally to make a difference! We thank everyone in our community who are also going dry for this important cause, and would love to hear from you if you'd like to share your Dry July story.

Funds raised through Dry July support an array of initiatives at the Canberra Region Cancer Centre. The Therapeutic Harp Program is one such service that is supported annually, and thanks to funds raised last year, the CRCC was equipped with two Sleep Pods. Many patients who come to the CRCC travel from interstate, so the addition of the sleep pods gives these patients the opportunity to relax and unwind in between appointments. Giving children a fun, colourful, and interactive virtual reality experience will be a great distraction, ultimately enhancing their hospital experience, while making work more streamlined for medical practitioners. Smileyscopes will make needle procedures a little less scary for paediatric patients

Method

Muddle together blueberries, mint, lime and sweetener in a glass for about 1 minute to release the juice from the blueberries and lime, and the flavour from the mint. If you don't have a muddler, use the back of a wooden spoon or similar


